Dear Friends,

We say, "We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen."

Living in a world where what they sense attracts their closest attention, many people spend much more time relating to the physical than to the spiritual.

They spend most of their time and money pursuing material rewards, relegating spiritual matters to the

edges of life. They do this despite the fact that they say they believe in the reality of God and that the spiritual life is very important to them.

How do you weigh the importance of the spiritual life relative to that of the physical or emotional? Before you answer that question consider where you spend your greatest efforts and assets in living your life. After all, you are probably quite certain that what you can touch, hear and see is real. You may feel that the spiritual may not be such a sure thing.

In considering this, I am reminded of something about the creation which, I believe, reflects a truth about the Creator. What we see when we look up into the night sky is just a small piece of that creation. In recent years X-ray telescopes have enabled astronomers to measure the mass of clusters of galaxies. They have found that about five percent of the mass can be accounted for by stars visible in the galaxies and another five percent by the gas between the galaxies of the clusters. The other ninety percent must be in some unknown form, referred to as dark matter, that has thus far escaped detection by any type of telescope. (This information I learned from reading The Universe, edited by Byron Preiss and published by Bantam Books.)

What we see in the night sky, what we consider to be the galaxies above, is really only a tiny portion of the mass, of what is really there. Ninety percent of the mass of up there is unseen and undetectable, yet very real. Is it a characteristic of the Creator, the God we worship, to order life in such a way that most of life's reality is unseen and waiting to be discovered, understood and lived into? If so, the material world in which we operate by means of our senses is likely only a small, even insignificant, part of the overall plan.

It might be that many people are investing too much of their effort in relating to what can be seen, and what is the least significant part of God's plan, and too little in what cannot be seen, the overwhelming mass of what God has created for us to experience and enjoy.

With the arrival of Advent and another ecclesiastical year now is a good time to refocus our efforts toward finding what is most important in life.

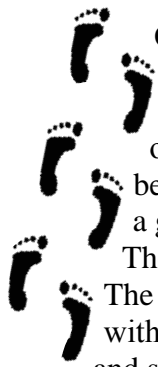

## VESTRY HIGHLIGHTS

The November Vestry meeting was held on Wednesday, November 16, 2011, in the Robert S. Taylor Memorial Library at 7:30 pm. Our discussions and deliberations included the following:

After opening prayer and centering and approval of the minutes of our last meeting, Treasurer Mike Greene reported on our finances through October. (See the report below for a summary of our revenues and expenses through October 31.) Mike noted that we exceeded our expenses last month due to quarterly expenses. These should even out over the next two months. In addition, pledge income is still below budget. Mike expects it will pick up again during the last two months of the year. Bob Taylor gave a report on the School's financial position, including a report on their building expansion funds. He also reported that the search for a new Director of School is going very well.

Bob Taylor then led a discussion on the Vestry's progress in accomplishing their Goals and Objectives for 2011-2012. Goals One and Two are being completed this fall. Jessica Backman suggested that perhaps we could look at additional activities to empower women on a local level. This idea will be discussed again, perhaps at our Vestry retreat in the spring. Goal #2, Objective 2, *Provide transportation to elderly who otherwise could not get to church.* It was decided that the office will develop a list of those people who are likely to have this need and then will recruit volunteer drivers. The volunteers at the front desk may be able to help with phone calls to those who may need this service.

Senior Warden Mark Chittum reported on the progress of the Stewardship 2012 campaign. We are at 88% of our goal and will be making telephone calls to seek the final 12%.

Mimi Howard reported that the estate sale conducted by the Pennies Shop at the Gill home netted \$8,500. In addition, pieces that did not sell are at the Pennies Shop or on ebay, so additional sales have been and will be made as a result of that generous opportunity. The Bazaar and Marketplace also did very well this year, making about \$8,300 for the several groups involved.

Junior Warden Peter Berg presented a list of the top four priorities for upcoming maintenance needs. These include repainting of the church exterior, replacing the 5 oldest air conditioning systems, providing gutters and downspouts on the south side of the church building, and the addition of insulation to the Parish Hall roof. These together are estimated to cost about \$56,000.

Mark Chittum noted that the Nomination Task Force, consisting of those who are leaving the Vestry, are taking nominations for the Vestry at this time.

Finally, Mark Chittum and Bob Taylor reported on the events of the Diocesan Convention, on November 11-12 at St. Joseph's Boynton Beach. The meeting closed at 9:30 with our Parish Prayer.
