Dear Friends,

The season of Epiphany, which began on January 6 and will continue until Ash Wednesday on February 22, is a time of emphasis on the manifestation of Jesus Christ to the world. Introduced on the Day of the Epiphany with the remembrance of the visitation of the three wisemen who came from a far country in the East to pay homage to the new-born Christ, the season emphasizes the fact that those Magi also returned to their country to the east, undoubtedly proclaiming the good news of Christ's birth to the world. Thus, during these weeks, we consider the importance of the spreading of the light of Christ into the world and our own responsibility for being disseminators of the Gospel. Traditionally, the Epiphany Season has been one in which the topic of mission has been highlighted, for mission entails the spreading of Christian love and service.

The word Epiphany derives from two Greek words. *Phanos* means "torch, light or lantern." *Epi* is translated into English as "upon." They are combined to form the word which reminds us that the birth of Christ was as a light shining upon the world's darkness. This combination also invites us to consider how that light might shine through us to enlighten life around us.

The Epiphany Window in our church stands as a beautiful metaphor of the shining of Christ's light upon us. Located high upon the highest eastern wall of the nave, the stained glass window, with its many vibrant colors and symbols of the Epiphany theme, receives the morning sunlight and, changing that light into a multitude of colors, manifests it upon the surfaces of our worship space. It is a metaphor which is designed to stimulate our thinking. In how many amazing ways can Christ's light and love touch our hearts and souls? How can our own unique personalities and skills be used by God to receive the light and love of Christ which are in us and shine them forth to those around us? How is the Gospel being made manifest to the world through us?

Jesus came as a light into the world. As his disciples we are called to use our lives for the spreading of that light, to be torches and lanterns upon the landscape we occupy.

A blessed Epiphany Season to you.

birds at the park. Some of the species Included were: coot, moorhen, purple gallinule, great blue heron, cattle egret, tricolor heron, little blue heron, green heron, snowy egret, great egret, black crowned night heron, sora (rail family), pied billed grebe, blue winged teal, mottled duck, black bellied whistling duck, white ibis, glossy ibis, osprey, woodstork, anhinga, double crested cormorant, red winged blackbird, mockingbird, vultures disant). 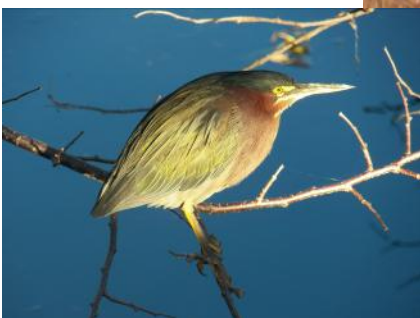


Left: A Blue heron perches on its nest as the sun sets at Wakodahatchee Wetlands.

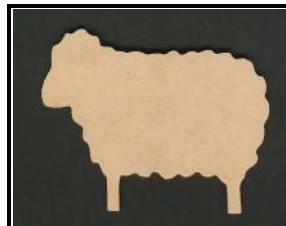

VESTRY HIGHLIGHTS

The January Vestry meeting was held on Wednesday, January 18, 2012, in the Robert S. Taylor Memorial Library at 7:30 pm. Our discussions and deliberations included the following:

The meeting opened with a prayer and with centering. The minutes of our December meeting were approved. Treasurer Mike Greene reported on our finances through the end of the year. (See the report below for a summary of our revenues and expenses through December 31, 2011.) Mike noted that pledge income was still below budget, but the excellent income created by the Pennies for Heaven shop and the various fundraisers such as Artie's Party came together to bring us closer to budget. In addition, expenses were less than budgeted, so we ended the year almost on budget.

Bob Taylor gave a report on the School's financial position, including a report on their building expansion funds. He later reported that the search for the new Director of School is going very well.

Stewardship Chairman and Senior Warden Mark Chittum reported that we are \$1,100 short in pledges to meet our revised budget for 2012. The Vestry voted to accept the proposed budget with the expectation that additional pledges will be forthcoming from people who are just arriving for the season.

Bob Taylor presented Clergy Housing Allowances to the Vestry for their approval for 2012. These allowances, which are an IRS designation within clergy income, were approved.

Bob Taylor also led a further discussion about potential policies concerning bequests, particularly one bequest that is anticipated to come to Good Shepherd soon. We will discuss these policies again at our Annual Vestry Retreat, but in the meantime, we will deposit such funds in some sort of interest-bearing account.

Junior Warden Peter Berg provided the Vestry with a copy of his report regarding particular projects that are becoming critical and for which we have no budget. This report will also be included in the Parish Annual Report.

Mark Chittum reported that the Nomination Task Force has completed its work and that four individuals are being nominated for presentation at the Annual Meeting. These nominees are: Peter Bohnsack, Dana Hoffman, Kevin Riddle and Tracy Smith.

Bob Taylor reviewed the agenda for the Annual Meeting and thanked each of the Vestry members who are going off the Vestry this month. After our Parish Prayer, the meeting was adjourned at 9:15pm.


