Dear Friends,

For several summers in the 1980's Marlene, our children and I spent a week with friends at Saranac Inn, New York, which is located on a beautiful lake nestled in the Adirondack Mountains. One day, when it was a blue-skied day with a temperature of around 80 degrees, my friend sighed and said with pleasure, "Ah, this is what we call a TAD, a True Adirondack Day." From the way he said it, I could tell that they do not get very many TADs up in those mountains and that, if they should happen to luck into a brief period of them, the early onset of fall will certainly not allow such days to go on for long. A TAD is, therefore, deeply appreciated in the Adirondacks.

When we moved to south Florida and settled into our first winter here, I realized that TADs in this part of the world are a dime a dozen, sans mountains, of course. Almost every winter day here is sunny and warm in the daytime and pleasantly cool at night. In fact, if one is not careful, one can fall into the trap of taking such weather for granted. It is always available for months at a stretch. Of course, we know that we should be thankful for every TAD regardless of how often they come our way.

We tend to take for granted many things in life which are easily available to us. Relatives from up north were recently visiting us and one asked me how often I go to the beach. To his surprise I said that I last went to the beach about three months ago, though that is one of my favorite places to spend time. It's there and I know that I can go there any time, but I get busy and don't.

The way to appreciate the aspects of life which are important to us is through discipline. Through a discipline of daily prayer we might be sure to offer thanks for the beautiful days we enjoy. By putting a visit to the beach on our weekly calendar and carrying out the visit with discipline, we will not fail to take advantage of one of the blessings of living here.

Our church is another of those opportunities which is here to enrich our lives. When we come to the Church of the Good Shepherd to worship and participate we find awaiting us a beautiful sacred space alive with fellow believers. Anyone who engages in this community will find that life becomes a bit more spirit-filled and purposeful. It is available to us any time we want it.

But, as with those TADs and the incredible beauty of the beach and the ocean, we can take church for granted, knowing it's always there. It takes discipline to take advantage of our church life and worship. As the sign on the door to the gym I attend says, "99% of the challenge is simply showing up."

I encourage you to make church attendance a weekly discipline, knowing that it will bring deeper spiritual fulfillment to your life. The beginning of a new year is the perfect time to commit or recommit to it.

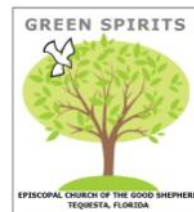

**Green Spirits Field Trip: Sunday, January 15 at 3:30pm. Meet at Wakodahatchee Wetlands** for some excellent wild-life viewing.

The name, Wakodahatchee, has an interesting history. It is derived from the Seminole Indian language and translates as "created waters." The created waters at Wakodahatchee Wetlands are an example of people giving something back to nature. Fifty acres of unused utilities land have been transformed into a wetlands ecosystem. It time, it has become a haven for local fauna as well as migratory birds—over 140 species have been spotted there!

Wakodahatchee has a three-quarter mile wheel chair accessible boardwalk. We will meet at the entrance at 3:30, as bird watching is best as the sun begins to set. Green Spirit Stephanie Grant will be on hand to talk to us about identifying some of the bird species we will see. This tour is free.

## Season of Advent

**Advent**, from the Latin word *adventus* meaning "coming" is a time of waiting and preparation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus. They are having a good look at the Creation story in a whole new light! *And it is Good!* It's a lot of fun to listen attentively to a story, that you've heard many times and yet hear it for the first time. The youth listen closely and learned things about the creation story they never new before...like, did you know there are two creation stories in Genesis? Well neither did they! We'll keep examining the creation stories and how powerful and mysterious they are. Soon we'll have creation posters, the world as they see it and how the creation story effects their lives. *And it is Good!*

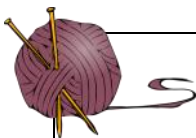

## VESTRY HIGHLIGHTS

The December Vestry meeting was held on Wednesday, December 21, 2011, in the Robert S. Taylor Memorial Library at 7:30 pm. Our discussions and deliberations included the following:

The meeting opened with a prayer and with centering and the minutes of our last meeting were approved. Treasurer Mike Greene reported on our finances through November. (See the report below for a summary of our revenues and expenses through November 30.) Mike noted that pledge income is still below budget. Mark Chittum reported for the Finance Committee on its review of the proposed budget for 2012. We have reached almost 95% of our pledge goal, so the Finance Committee cut the budget by \$31,000 without having to adversely affect personnel requirements. This means we will not require a Faith Challenge this year.

Bob Taylor gave a report on the School's financial position, including a report on their building expansion funds. He later reported that the search for the new Director of School is going very well.

Paul Kirby reported that he will call a meeting between the church and the school to discuss long-range planning goals for both entities and to record those goals for future reference.

Senior Warden Mark Chittum reported that the Planned Giving Task Force is being developed. The following persons were approved by the Vestry to serve on the Task Force: Steve Parson, Dave Downing, Tom Walch, Katharine Murray and Brent Murray. Mark reported that additional persons are under consideration as well.

Bob Taylor led a discussion about the foci for the annual meeting. The Vestry suggested that our Outreach programs (such as number of people we have helped) and the changes being made at the school were two areas of interest for our congregation.

We held a brief discussion to determine what policy we should follow for accepting bequests. The Vestry decided that bequests should be deposited into our account and then we should immediately acquire one or more short-term CDs until the Vestry decides upon a permanent position for the bequest.

Bob Taylor reported on behalf of Junior Warden Peter Berg, who has been working with the school regarding the possibility of monthly Saturday evening family services, followed by pot luck suppers, in the Parish Hall. These discussions will continue after the first of the year.

The meeting closed at 9:30 with our Parish Prayer.

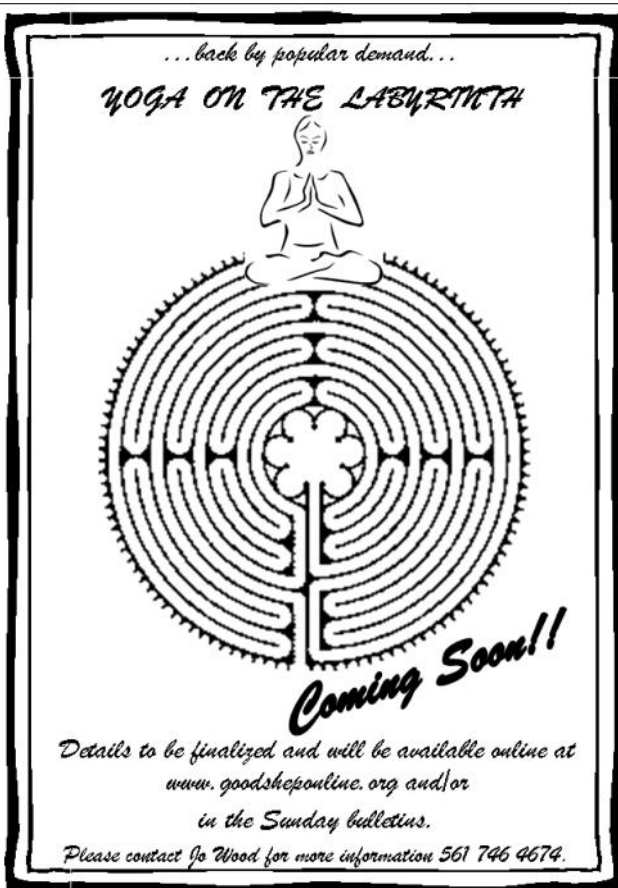

For many years, Good Shepherd has donated to FOOD FOR THE POOR, the largest international relief and development charity in the United States, feeding 2 million poor every day. Their Christian relief programs and projects help children and the poorest of the poor by providing food, housing, health care, education, water projects, emergency relief and micro-enterprise. According to the Chronicle of Philanthropy, Food for the Poor has maintained fundraising and administrative costs of less than 4% of its expenses; **more than 96% of all donations go directly to programs that help the poor.** In fact, it takes only 5 cents for them to provide a meal to a starving child.

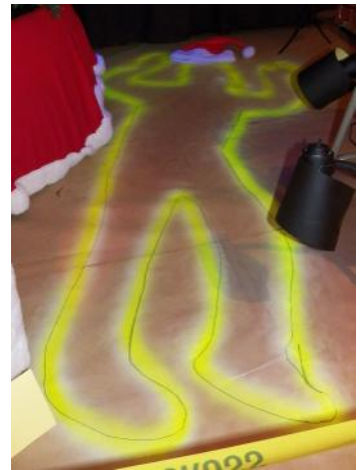

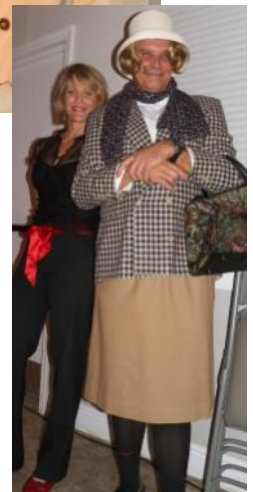


**GOOD SHEPHERD EVEN HAS PLACE FOR MYSTERY AND MAYHEM!**


