Dear Friends,

Good Shepherd's Vestry held its annual retreat on Friday night, April 30 and Saturday, May 1 for the purpose of spending some time reviewing and assessing our parish life and programs, and to set some specific goals for the coming year. The goals we set do not cover the full breadth of the life and ministry we share at Good Shepherd, but they act as a focus to help us accomplish a few

additional important plans which, we feel, need our attention at this time. We set three such goals.

In furthering our long-range parish goal of exploring the Millennium Development Goals set by the U.N. to alleviate poverty and suffering in the world, we will encourage our parish to focus on the

Our initial objectives toward reaching this goal will include continuation of our strong efforts to provide high quality education locally for children through our Sunday School and Good Shepherd Episcopal School. We will also set our sights on reaching out to children who live in circumstances which are far less advantaged. Specifically, we hope to work in collaboration with an existing ministry in Bondeau, Haiti, to provide a classroom and teacher for the school there. It would cost us about \$2,000 to sponsor one class and it would be a way of providing primary education for children who desperately need it. We would hope to include our own school children in the project, including the establishment of a pen pal relationship between our children and Bondeau's. Additionally, we will sponsor two children in their education through Ak Tenamit, the program which is making a tremendous difference in the lives of the very poor people of Guatemala.


Another goal is to continue in addressing necessary **property maintenance and improvements**. We plan to hurricane-proof the windows and doors of the Parish Hall and to purchase and install a cardiac defibrillator in the church. Additionally, we are creating a new wish list of five most important property improvement needs so that interested parishioners may provide support to implement those repairs and improvements. Simply stated, there are maintenance and improvements which need to be addressed and we plan to do so.

Our third goal focuses on the development and **implementation of a planning process regarding Church and School vision and needs**. As our school continues to develop there are needs which have been identified which we hope to meet. For instance, a science lab, a clinic space for children who may become ill at school and administrative space have been identified as being needed as soon as possible. Our church also has need for additional space especially for youth ministries and storage. In order to plan for our future together, the vestry has planned an interactive process to identify the needs of both our church and school and a plan to meet those needs. One objective of this process will be to hold a town hall style meeting(s) at which all hopes and ideas will be able to be voiced and heard.

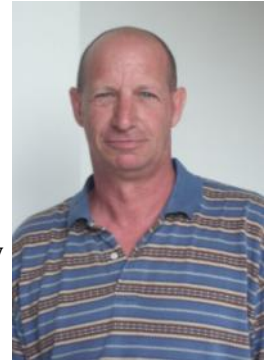

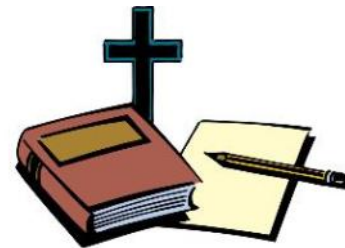
## Pennies For Heaven Volunteer Opportunity

The 18 hour event took place in Constitution Park and attracted individuals, teams and local businesses. Not only did the event help raise awareness to remain vigilant in the fight against cancer, but it also raised over \$28,000!

After the Survivor's lap and Caregiver's lap, the individuals and teams took to the track and the walking/running commenced. Throughout the course of the day, everyone enjoyed the various bands, DJ's and delicious food on offer.

At 8:30 p.m. the very moving Luminaria ceremony started. The lights in the park were turned off and the path was lined with candlelit paper bags each written with a prayer, tribute or remembrance. The participants moved silently along the path in quiet observation thinking about family and friends who have been touched by cancer.

The event progressed on with a midnight movie, and a continued trickle of walkers throughout the early hours of the night until the pancake breakfast at 6:00 a.m. From start to finish Team Good Shepherd was on the track with determined dedication and enthusiasm.

# Millennium Development Goals Update

The Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) are eight goals agreed to in 2000 by 189 worldwide heads of state and government -- including the United States -- that address the deepest material brokenness in the world today. Established through a United Nations initiative, the Episcopal Church has embraced this calling. In 2006, the General Convention declared the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) to be the top mission priority of the Episcopal Church. Why should we, as Christians care?

Our scripture and tradition is overflowing with God calling us to feed the hungry, clothe the naked, care for the sick, nurture children, steward creation and everything else the MDGs are about. As Bob mentioned in his letter, the challenge our Vestry has decided to address this year is to achieve universal primary education.



Approximately 77 million children do not attend primary school worldwide. This year, we would like to do our part to help ensure that girls and boys everywhere are able to complete primary school. In the coming year, Good Shepherd will present very real ways we can all pitch in.

# Vestry Highlights

The Vestry met on Wednesday, May 19, 2010, in the library of the Ryon Building at 7:30 pm. The meeting is summarized as follows:

**OPENED:** with prayer followed by centering. The agenda and the minutes were approved as presented.

**HEARD REPORTS:** Mike Greene, Treasurer, presented the Church financials for April 2010. Bob Taylor presented the School's financial report for January 2010.

Bob Taylor gave an update on progress with our staffing as follows: Jo Wood has joined us for half-time as Director of Newcomer Ministry; Michelle Murasko is our new bookkeeper who is here on Mondays; and we have very recently hired Bill Jowett to serve as sexton, half time, working with John Prosser and the cleaning service.

Katharine Murray, Junior Warden, reported that she and John Prosser have been or will be working on three projects. These include the Columbarium garden on the north side of the church and the garden on the south side; a deep cleaning project for the Parish Hall and kitchen; and some sort of resolution for the paint which continues to peel from the trim on the church.

Katharine also presented information about some property within Gallery Square North that is for sale. The Vestry discussed this but decided that use of the space as is might be somewhat restricted for either the church or the school and therefore no action should be taken at this time.

As a follow-up to the Vestry Retreat held at the end of April, Bob Taylor presented the goals and objectives that resulted from the Retreat. These included the following:

**Further explore the Millennium Development Goals (MDGs) by encouraging our**

To achieve this goal, we will work with St. Gregory's, Boca Raton, to support a primary school in Haiti. Through our Outreach ministry, we will continue to support two students through the adopt-a-student-program of Guatemala Tomorrow. We will support our own Good Shepherd School and include the students in our commitment to primary education. And we will provide information on this MDG to the parish and the school on a monthly basis.

**We will continue to address necessary property maintenance and improvements.**

To achieve this goal, we will hurricane-proof the windows and doors of the Parish Hall this summer. We will ascertain the price for a cardiac defibrillator and, if feasible, purchase and install by mid-August. By the August Vestry meeting, we will create a new wish list of five property improvement needs to present to the parish.

**We will continue to develop and implement a planning process regarding Church and School vision and needs.**

The following steps will be taken for this goal: Find a land planner/architect who will discuss possibilities with us for further development or redevelopment of our property. Establish a committee of the Vestry to meet with this individual. Secure a facilitator who is agreeable to both the church and the school leadership to hold an interactive process to lead toward fulfillment of program and property needs. By next winter, hold a collaborative process to define shared needs and goals. And immediately establish a joint committee from both the school and the church to push this goal through to completion.

**DECIDED:** To hold the June Vestry meeting on Tuesday, June 22, since Bob Taylor would be on the Youth Mission trip at the time of our regular meeting.

**CLOSED:** with our Parish Prayer.

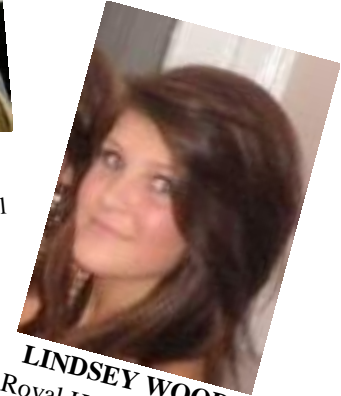

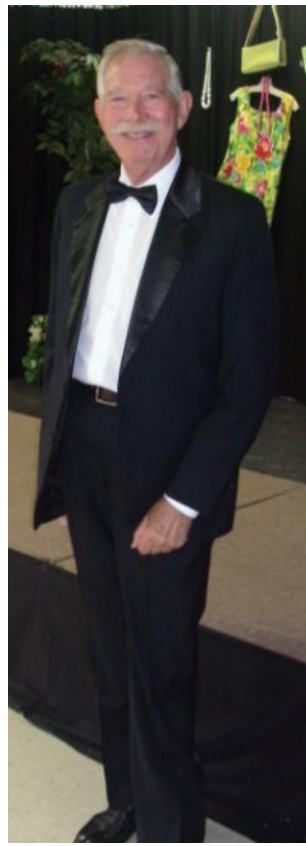

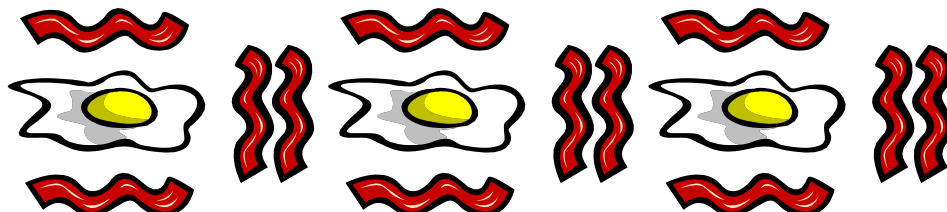
