Dear Friends,

One never knows where a pastoral call will lead.

Last spring I received a telephone call from a Hospice nurse who told me that a woman in an assisted living facility in Pt. St.

Lucie was requesting that the rector of her church, Good Shepherd, Tequesta, bring her Communion. Hearing the woman's name and not recognizing it, I looked in our records to find that she had visited our church a time or two and registered as a newcomer several years earlier when she lived in Tequesta. I made

the visit and enjoyed meeting her. Then I made a note to visit her again in September.

A week ago, when I called to see if she could accept a visit, I was told that she had been moved to a nursing facility in Ft. Pierce where she was in the "Memory Unit." Before making the fifty minute drive, I called that facility to see if she would understand who I was and why I was there. I was told by a nurse that she would probably understand. I decided to make the trip.

Our visit was pleasant as we talked about memories she could remember. Family pictures gave me material with which to work in exploring meaningful aspects of her life. I asked her about the carefully folded American flag which was on a shelf over the head of her bed. It had been given to her at the time of her husband's death. She was able to remember that he had served in North Africa and Europe. At a point, I asked if she would then like to receive Communion, to which she replied that she would.

As I prepared the Communion set, she still must have been thinking about her husband and his service to our country during World War Two because, suddenly, she began to recite words from a long-past memorization. She began, "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal..." She paused. I joined in as she continued, "Life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness." She was recalling the Declaration of Independence. She said that she had memorized it as a child; that it was important for people to know back then. In fact, she noted, it was important for any time. I nodded my agreement, thinking that those words, put to paper at the time of our nation's beginning, are, indeed, worth considering in these times.

The glorious mixture of the woman's lucidity and confusion was emphasized a few minutes later when, as I led her in the Lord's Prayer, I heard her inserting words from the Declaration of Independence into the phrases of the prayer. Her love of God and love of country were intertwined in unintended artistry.

During my somewhat lengthy drive back to Tequesta I had plenty of time to consider the double blessings of living in a country of freedom and opportunity and having the love and grace of God to guide us daily. The woman on whom I had called had reminded me to remember and give thanks for these blessings.

I also considered the fact that I had called the nursing facility earlier that morning to ask if she would understand who I was and why I was there. Ironically, the tables had been turned on me and it was up to me to understand who she was and why I was there. One never knows where a pastoral call will lead.

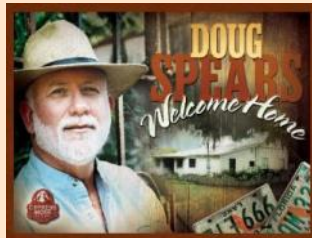
Family Friendly Night of Music and Fun

Truly, you'll never see more Moorhens in one place! We saw over 18 species of birds, some of them quite uncommon, including the Black-bellied Whistling Duck and a Sora. For many, the Roseate Spoonbills were the grand finale, drawing quite a few serious photographers. 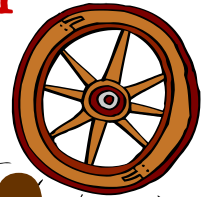

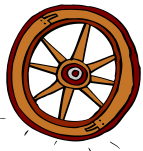
