Dear Friends,

Many of you may recall that we celebrated the Church of the Good Shepherd's fiftieth anniversary in October 2007. This month we will celebrate the fortieth anniversary of the establishment of our Pennies for Heaven thrift shop. A little quick math will reveal that it took only fourteen years for the founders of our church to realize that it would be a good idea to include such a ministry in the life of this parish. It was a

wise decision and one wonders now what took them so long. Considering the multiplicity of ways in which Pennies benefits our parish and the wider community, it is hard to imagine the Church of the Good Shepherd without Pennies for Heaven.

Twenty-six year-round and fourteen seasonal volunteers currently operate the Pennies ministry. Those people experience a sense of purpose in working in the shop and they develop friendships with each other, sharing camaraderie in carrying out a ministry spiced with variation, challenge and fun. While Pennies for Heaven is a context for recycling our material goods, providing high-quality, low-cost goods and clothing for the people of our community, our volunteers come to know the customers, providing a service which eases the burden of making ends meet when struggling with a high cost of living. Often, it turns out that the Pennies ministry is, in fact, pastoral ministry.

It is also outreach ministry, providing assistance to quite a few communities outside of Tequesta and Jupiter. If items go unsold for a period of time they are transported to people in need in Indiantown or Pahokee. Over time, items have been donated to outreach centers in Belle Glade as well as to outreach ministries such as St. George's Center in Riviera Beach, West Gate Tabernacle in West Palm Beach, House of Hope in Hobe Sound and Stuart, the Seamen's Institute, Hannah's House and Faith Farm. Recently, our all-parish White Elephant Sale has been carried out in tandem with the Pennies Shop.

Not only do the Pennies volunteers have big hearts, but they are also a very good-looking bunch. One need go no further than to our annual Young at Heart Luncheon and Pennies Fashion Show to see handsome people modeling sharp-looking clothes from the Shop!

Oh, and did I mention that, without the support of Pennies for Heaven, our parish operating budget would not enable us to carry out many of our much-needed ministries, including our far-reaching parish outreach program? The \$54,000 provided for parish operations by Pennies in 2011 makes all the difference in the world to Good Shepherd's ability to thrive.

Sporting forty years of faithful volunteers and an equal measure of positive impact on our church and community, Pennies for Heaven is a blessing for which we give thanks to God. We celebrate its forty years this month!

Our Outreach Dollars at Work

One of the many ministries that Good Shepherd helps financially is St. Laurence Chapel in Broward County. St. Laurence Chapel is a not for profit organization providing services to people who are homeless or near homeless. The Chapel has been providing help and hope to the homeless and hungry in Broward County for over 20 years. The services provided include hot breakfast and lunch, hot showers, clean clothes and towels, case management, group counseling, medical assistance, mailing address, use of telephones and other services to assist clients in meeting their basic needs. The mission statement for St. Laurence Chapel is "To proclaim God's love for people who are hungry and homeless by providing hope and help in a caring and non-judgmental environment."

RUN-SING-PRAY! The annual youth 1.8-mile Walk-With-a-Purpose was a triumph! Walkers and runners all came out on that ominous Saturday morning to walk with God and take time out for prayer at two different prayer stations. This small yet powerful pilgrimage has become a very special morning for the youth as well as those who participate. Laughter and music vibrate through the parish hall, the smell of coffee and fresh cut oranges float through the air and helps to gear up our walkers and runners. The walk begins! The rope drops and off go the runners followed by the gentle pace of our walkers. The runners quickly return with great satisfaction and feelings of accomplishment on their faces and the cloudy morning turns into a bright sunny day! We wait patiently for lead biker Dave Schuppert to escort our final walkers and our prayer stations attendees back to the finish line. Our closing Eucharist opens as the sky opens up with sunshine. What a wonderful way to start your Saturday morning. If you missed this humble morning—mark your calendar for next October. It truly is an uplifting day. **MIND-BODY-SOUL!**



October wouldn't be complete without the *Oktoberfest* which is our way of thanking the parish and sharing the mission trip experiences. The dinner is a highlight of our youth ministry. VESTRY HIGHLIGHTS

The October Vestry meeting was held on Wednesday, October 19, 2011, in the Robert S. Taylor Memorial Library at 7:30 pm. Our discussions and deliberations included the following:

After opening prayer and centering and approval of the minutes of our last meeting, Treasurer Mike Greene reported on our finances through August. (See the report below for a summary of our revenues and expenses through September 30.) Bob Taylor gave a report on the School's financial position, and introduced a new report on their building expansion funds.

Beth Long, on behalf of Marcia Pollard, presented a report on the school's long-term (5-7 years) perceived needs. These included conducting a joint school/church planning process to maximize potential joint usage of any new facilities.

Bob Taylor led a discussion on the Vestry's progress in accomplishing their Goals and Objective for 2011-2012. Goals One and Two are being completed this fall. The children's choir will perform on November 6 in the church. Our goal toward a better understanding of MDG #3, Empowerment of Women, has been in progress since early September. We are almost ready to pursue final cost estimates for major maintenance needs, and our goal to understand the school's plans for the future has been accomplished.

The Vestry then made a list of the church's needs over the next 5-7 years, without consideration of priority at this time. These included:

- Storage space!
- More space for the Pennies Shop
- More space for the Youth Group meetings
- Ability to support Family Promise
- More space for Sunday School
- Kids and youth play equipment
- Gymnasium or cafetorium
- More office space
- Replace Parish Hall.

Important Request

If you make a stock gift to the church for memorial gifts, for endowment, or for your pledge, please let the clergy know about it. We are unable to identify the source of such gifts unless you have told us. We want to properly recognize and allocate your gift.

It was decided by the Vestry that a former goal of building a Senior Center was no longer pressing as such centers are now available in northern Palm Beach County and in Martin County through public agencies.

The Rector then appointed the Nominations Task Force for nominations to the 2012-2013 Vestry. These include Bob Taylor and Vestry members who are rotating off this year: Mark Chittum, Debbie Gilbert, Beth Long and Mason Walsh.

The following Lay Eucharistic Ministers have been trained for service and were approved for licensure by the Vestry: Carol Block, Jeanette Brown, Cynthia Currin, Dana Hoffman, and Diane Spero.

Senior Warden and Stewardship Chairman Mark Chittum presented the results to date of the campaign for the 2012 budget. As of the time of this meeting, we had reached 61% of our goal, with 10 days to go to make our target date. He urged the Vestry to provide leadership in this area.

Mimi Howard presented some of the upcoming events at Good Shepherd, including:

Good Shepherd Bazaar and Marketplace on November 5, Diana Frade as our preacher on November 6, Walter Beaman as our speaker at Young at Heart Luncheon on November 17, Ecumenical Service at Church of the Latter Day Saints on November 23, Thanksgiving Day Service on November 24, "Run for the Pies" on November 24, and "A Christmas Caper" Dinner on December 2.

We closed at 9:30 with our Parish Prayer.

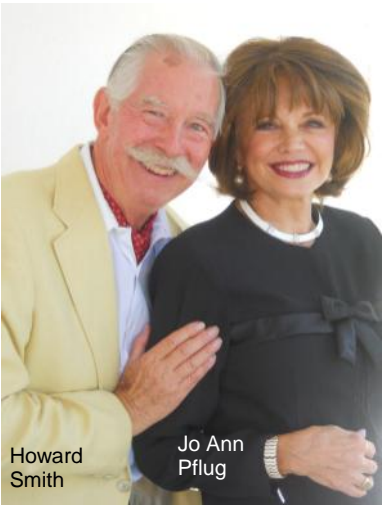

Peter said: "In the name of Jesus Christ stand up and walk." Acts 3:6b

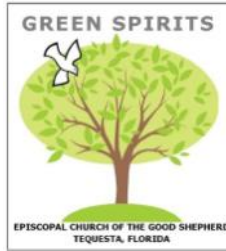

Despite overcast skies, we saw a fantastic wing-flapping dance by a very close family of Sandhill cranes in addition to seeing many ibis, hawks, woodpeckers, cormorants, anhingas, Great egrets, a grosbeak and more! **Stephanie Grant** gave us a great intro to spotting and identifying wildlife (we also saw a deer) while **Dave Cowan** and **Bill Young** took photos.
